Ministry Musings

Recently I have been reading through the book of Acts, partly to follow with the new TV series “A.D. The Bible Continues.” I came across a passage in Acts 8:36-43 which touched me. It’s the story of a woman in Joppa named Dorcas or Tabitha who had just died. The passage says, “She was full of good works and generous deeds.” It seems she had been making clothes and caring for the widows in the area. When Peter got to Joppa, all of the widows took him to where she had been laid and showed them all of the clothing she had made and the other things she had done. When Peter saw what her ministry had been, he took her by the hand and raised her up; not by his power, but by the power of Jesus through him! It reminded me of how it’s easy to see those, like the apostles, who are out front in their ministry; Bible Study and small group leaders and participants, the church council, the staff, those who do the reading, soundboard, assisting Pastor Mark or play instruments or sing during worship and the leaders and members of our Ministry Teams.

But I wonder how many Dorcas’ we have among us, both male and female? I never realized until I started coming in every morning how many people do so much around here. Quilts and prayer shawls are made and blessed to comfort and warm; others make crafts as their contribution; we have faith chests and baptismal blankets and we can see those tangible items and rejoice. But there are countless others who minister in even more quiet and unseen ways: the guys who are here nearly every week caring for our building so it is a warm welcoming place and those who care for the grounds outside to accomplish the same welcoming presence. The many hands it takes to prepare and serve a funeral luncheon that comforts and lets the bereaved know that we are standing with them in their grief; the sending of cards to all who mourn and rejoice; the one who comes on Wednesday mornings to set up the tables for dinner and those who them down; those who care for the altar so it too is welcoming to God’s people and make and set up the beautiful banners to inspire us are all part of ministry. There are almost countless numbers work with children, confirmation age and youth in many and various ways to help them grow their faith and those who pray daily for all of the petitions brought to us through the prayer chain. There are many who bring food and work in the food pantry and PADS or go to NIFB or FMSC so that all may be fed physically as well as spiritually and the ones who go elsewhere to share God’s love for people in other places including taking Communion to our family members who can’t be here in worship. Many hands bake, set up and take down coffee hour so

we can fellowship together. And what would we do without the ones who work behind the scenes to fold bulletins and count offerings each week or fold newsletters each month. And let's not forget all of those who lead the fellowship ministries so we can have playtime together as a family! And there are a myriad of others who minister in ways we are not even aware of.

Let us remember that cleaning up the kitchen after an event is just as much serving Jesus and caring for his people as being assistant minister or communion steward on Sunday morning and that crocheting a prayer shawl or building a faith chest brings Jesus to people as much as being a Minister of Communion From the Assembly. It takes each and every one of us doing our little piece to make the whole ministry of SOTP come together. All done for Jesus is our calling from God and he says, "*Well done good and faithful servants!*"

PROMPOSALS

With prom season once again in full-swing, there's a new prom ingredient that's costing our kids lots of money, and is worth our time and attention. This new prom phenomenon is known as the "promposal." A promposal is an elaborate invitation to the prom that is much like a carefully planned and executed marriage proposal. Teens are employing surprises, staged events, billboards, and jumbotron screens in an effort to one-up and out-do everyone else. There's even a Pinterest page featuring promposal ideas. A new nationwide survey by the folks at Visa tell us that the promposal is costing the average American household with teenagers a whopping \$324 this year. In fact, the promposal price now makes up almost a third of the total cost per person for attending a prom. The question we must ask is how much is too much? And where will this all stop? Once again, we recommend that you encourage your kids to exercise the highest principles of biblical stewardship in all of life, including the prom.



Latest Research
SEXUAL AGGRESSION

It should be no surprise that the hypersexualization of our culture along with the rapid spread of pornography has lead to more sexually aggressive behavior among young people who have been nurtured by these messages. Now, the CDC is reporting that 21% of high school girls say they have been

physically or sexually assaulted by someone they dated, a figure that is 2X higher than what was previously estimated. In addition, 10% of high school boys report being

physically or sexually assaulted by a dating partner. Researchers are also saying that they're seeing this kind of violence in children as young as ten and eleven years old. In the book of Ephesians, the Apostle Paul instructs Christ's followers to be kind to one another, to be tenderhearted, and to be compassionate. Parents, this is a message we must communicate to our kids along with God's standards for their sexuality. We must counter the negative influence of a sexually aggressive culture by pointing our kids to God's will and God's way

QUICK STATS

Teenagers ages 16-19 who spent more than 2 hours after school engaged in screen time experienced greater difficulty falling asleep and a shorter duration of sleep. When daytime screen use totaled 4 or more hours, teenagers had a 49% greater risk of taking longer than an hour to fall asleep.

When your teenager makes decisions that are sinful and wrong, it can leave you reeling and full of questions. You will find yourself asking, how could this happen? Why did this happen? Have I done anything to cause this? God, what are you trying to teach us? God, do you even care? Will my child get through this?

“But I trust in your unfailing love; my heart rejoices in your salvation. I will sing to the Lord, for he has been good to me.”

The first part of Psalm 13 records the words of a helpless person longing for answers and hope: “How long, O Lord? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me? How long must I wrestle with my thoughts and every day have sorrow in my heart? How long will my enemy triumph over me? Look on me and answer, O Lord my God. Give light to

my eyes, or I will sleep in death; my enemy will say, ‘I have overcome him,’ and my foes will rejoice when I fall.”

There will be times when your feelings of helplessness keep you locked on those first few verses of Psalm 13. But at some point, God will graciously bring you through those words to the point where you can join with the Psalmist in celebrating God’s goodness through the last two verses of Psalm 13: “But I trust in your unfailing love; my heart rejoices in your salvation. I will sing to the Lord, for he has been good to me.”

Next month, our church will be getting a mountain makeover as we begin a unique adventure at Everest VBS! Kids will worship God through songs and prayer, and discover life-changing Bible truths in fun and memorable ways.



To have the best adventure possible, we need lots of volunteers who can give some time, energy, and love to the kids who will attend. So let me share a few ideas about ways you might be able to make this program a success. Please check out the following list, and then pray about where God might use you.

Station Leaders: Use easy-to-follow station leader manuals and prepare a 20-minute session each day, which you will repeat with four different groups of approximately 20 kids. We need leaders for the following stations:

- **Cinema Station** (video featuring the real-life adventures of real kids and discussion)

- **Sound System Station** (work with the music volunteers to present songs, and dances)
- **Photographer** (take candid pictures of children during VBS week)

General Fund Notes: Through April, operating income exceed expenses by \$9,203.34. Member contributions are more than budget and that is partially due to an annual gift of over \$6,000.00. Expenses are under budget \$12,133.04. Overall General Fund Income is more than Expenses to Budget YTD \$13,700.34 prior to funding Provision Accounts and includes the \$6,000.00 annual gift. We continue to encourage the restraint of staff and mission teams in their spending in the various expense categories.
