A Note From Pastor Mark

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Whatever your level of belief, know that Jesus is in charge of both life and death. He walks with us each day.

He allows the real stuff of life to challenge us and teach us. He rescues us from being destroyed by the hardness of life. He gives us peace of mind when we are confused. He promises to be there for us at death's door and beyond.

Looking once again at the Easter from John we hear the words of our Lord once again, "Peace be with you" spoken to his followers on the next evening following his resurrection. His disciples were probably feeling anything but peace as the political and religious powers went about destroying remnants of Jesus' ministry. They clung together behind locked doors in fear. But Jesus found them, walking right through the locked door.

A week later he comes to them again and repeats "Peace be with you."

I remember times when Jesus' peace was with me in difficult situations and I couldn't understand how it could be?

There were many other times that I felt like Peter at the tomb, confused and bewildered about life's happenings, and didn't open my heart and mind to Jesus' peace.

Jesus tells us that he knows his own. He not only knows our name and thoughts but he knows how many hairs are on our head. He knows how we were formed in our mother's womb.

It is a relief to know that when Jesus called Mary by name at the tomb, her confusion and despondency left her and she recognized her Maker. These are some of the most tender words in all of Scripture.

We have hope that when Jesus calls each of our names, our eyes will be opened, our hearts will burn with love and understanding, and peace will come upon us as we see the "Truth" face to face.

Meanwhile, until death's call, we have the privilege of walking with our Lord by reading God's life giving Word and in prayer with him. Even though life will still be confusing and difficult at times, we can continue to build our relationship with him.

- What life experiences have been difficult for you? What helped you get through them?
- Have you been a source of hope for another in trying times?

Ponder these questions and be faithful in your life as a disciple. I'll see you in worship.

theirs. More's the pity. But love letters these three couples did send, a lost art today.

The apostle Paul also wrote a love letter--to the church at Philippi. Although short, only four chapters, it expresses his great affection for those early Christians who made up the first church in Europe. Paul, of course, wrote other letters too, many of which have been preserved in the New Testament. But those are different in tone. Romans and Galatians are theological treatises. His letters to the Corinthians and Thessalonians address current problems and challenges in those congregations. But his letter to the Philippians, even though there were issues to be resolved, is full of love. "I thank God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for you," he begins.

So during the Easter season, we'll focus on this letter, beginning April 3. We'll meet each Sunday morning at 10:20 and then twice on Wednesdays -- at 11:00 in the morning and at 7:00 in the evening. We'd be delighted if you'd join us!

2016 LENTEN & EASTER OFFERINGS

Lenten Offerings are divided between the following charities:

* Feed My Starving Children:

Volunteers (like our SOTP youth) pack fortified meals which are sent to 70 countries around the world to feed malnourished children.

* Community Crisis Center:

Located in Elgin, this Center provides emergency shelter, no-cost counseling, food and other help for women and children in Kane County.

* Senior Care Volunteer Network:

Formerly Faith in Action, they assist our senior neighbors in McHenry County and Sun City to live independently in their own homes. Some of the no-cost services provided are transportation, companionship, home and yard maintenance, and respite for caregivers.

* Lutheran Social Services of Illinois:

LSSI is the largest statewide provider of social services to those in need in communities across the state. These include children's services, behavioral health services, family and prison ministry, senior services. Our contribution will go where it is most needed at this time.



The Easter Offering is given to Lutheran Social Services of Illinois: LSSI, the largest statewide provider of social services, has found it necessary to drastically cut services to 4,700 people and eliminate 750 staff positions. This is because the state has not paid LSSI for services provided due to the state's inability to pass a budget.

FROM THE WORD...

The book of Proverbs – a book of wisdom – reminds parents in Proverbs 22:6 of their responsibility to teach and train their children in ways that reorient children and teens away from a lifestyle of selfishness and towards a wise and prudent way of life that steers clear of danger (v. 22:5). Proverbs 22:6 offers multiple levels of wise and good advice to parents. First, parents are the ones who are to provide training. In our current culture, this means that we don't leave the moral education of our kids up to the media, peer group, or prevailing spirit of the times. As parents, God has given us both authority and a duty to take charge.

Second, we must recognize and respect our kids' God-given bents and abilities. In other words, "the way he should go" takes into account their Godgiven uniqueness. We must help them discover and use their distinct gifts and abilities. Finally, the effort we put into obediently following God's command to train our kids will result in our kids growing up

"Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it." Proverbs 22:6

with the opportunity to choose to live by the course we've charted for them as we've encouraged them to choose God's wise way rather than their own foolish path. While it's not a hard-and-fast promise, it is a general statement of how things will most likely turn out. Are you parenting your kids with wisdom?
