# A Note From Pastor Mark

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last weekend was Pentecost (the sending of the Spirit) and our Gospel reading was from John 14, Jesus' farewell address anxiety among the disciples. When Jesus leaves us, what then? "Lord show us the Father..."

Philip demands. Jesus says, "I am in the Father and the Father is in me" (John 14:11 RSV). This is all well and good. But more assurance is needed. Jesus finally says, "...the Father will give you another Counselor, to be with you forever..." (John 14:16 RSV). John is the only gospel who uses "counselor" or "advocate" to describe the Holy Spirit.

Have you experienced a situation where you have acted on behalf of another as an advocate or counselor? Or have you had someone be an advocate for you?

What were the circumstances? What was it like being an advocate or having an advocate?

For the disciples of Jesus, the experience of being sent into the world can feel like abandonment. On what can we count? What or who can help us make decisions?

Jesus says to the disciples, "These things I have spoken to you, while I am still with you. But the Counselor, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you" (John 14:25-26 RSV). There it is! The Holy Spirit, counselor and advocate, improves our memory!

What a powerful thing it is to have a memory return. Something I haven't thought about for years may come back to me like a gift discovered in an old trunk. In fact, important experiences forgotten may often come to mind just when we need them. If we are to believe John's Gospel witness, this is the work of God's Holy Spirit.

The older I get, the more important memory is.

As we go into the world, like the first disciples, on behalf of Christ, and move outward in mission, we can count on the Holy Spirit to help us remember (what is truly important), give us wisdom and support our ministry of witness. The Holy Spirit helps us go forth in mission.

Otherwise, we hang back terrified, unsure or focus on things of this world. Courage to move out in mission is possible because of the Holy Spirit. Jesus gives these words of comfort to those who are fearful, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives

do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid" (John 14:27 RSV).

As we move through these days of summer into God's mission field, I pray you will not be afraid. Through the Holy Spirit, remember God's grace poured out for you through the gift of Jesus Christ, God's Son, our Lord is sufficient.

Recently I read this passage on morning as part of my "coffee with God" time, and saw

something for the first time; the word DAILY. I had never noticed that in Luke Jesus says that we must take up our cross DAILY. In both

# Ministry Musings (Cont.)

Matthew and Mark this saying of Jesus does not include the word daily.

The commentary I read for that day said, "discipleship is an ongoing way of life (DAILY), and the self-denial of discipleship is not a matter of denying the self of various things, but of putting the cause of Christ ahead of all of the desires of self. Furthermore, the cross that is to be borne is more than a hardship that must be endured, like a chronic illness. It is the result of the decision to take up ... DAILY the life of self-giving love, even at the cost of one's life".

So what does that mean for me? That deciding to follow Jesus is a daily choice, not a one-time moment.

That putting him first is deciding over and over and over again. It's not a 'one and done' thing, but a decision that might need to be made every few moments. It's choosing an option at each temptation, each opportunity, each time I am called to follow God in whatever juncture is offered.

I found this idea extremely freeing! I grew up with a 'one and done' mentality in regards to faith. As a teen I remember the idea that you made a 'decision for Christ' at an altar call, or confirmation, or a youth camp retreat, or some other moment in time and that was it! Life moved forward from that point and you easily walked with God forever. But I found that even though I made that commitment to God, surrendered to God, gave him all of me or however else it was phrased, the smooth journey I anticipated and expected didn't seem to follow.

When I messed up of got off the path, I was sure it was because I hadn't made a "complete" commitment, or surrendered "all of me", (surrender was a big buzz word back then) so I would try again to make that 'one and done', total commitment to God; and once again I would mess up. I thought that 'one and done' was how it worked and felt like a failure – to myself and God.

But following Jesus isn't 'one and done'. In Luke Jesus says, "take up...DAILY'. What a relief that is for me. I can make that decision for him, commit my life, surrender myself over and over again! And each

time I return home like the prodigal son, he welcomes and forgives me and off we go on this journey of life once more...together!

**LOOP IT** - You may not have heard the word before but it will be an important part of the new worship center for our **hearing impaired** members and visitors. The **LOOP-IT** system was installed on the floor prior to the flooring installation. The system will allow those with a hearing aid equipped with a t-coil to hear better. It even works if you have a cochlear implant. The system has other options for the hearing impaired. The Loop-it system was a cost of \$5200.00. A partial gift has already been received for the system. It is an item on the Building on Faith list for anyone who would like to contribute. Questions on the LOOP-IT system may be directed to our council president, Bud Hansen who has already adapted his hearing aid for this new system. Thank you for your consideration.


## **VBS WORK DAY ~ DECORATION BUILDING**

## **BOOK CHATTERS NEW READING LIST**

Book Chatters have been meeting at 1 p.m. on the third Wednesday September through June for several years now; we forget just how many. There are five or six stalwarts who've been in the group all along, but others drop in and out depending on travel plans, book titles or even the weather. We'd like you to join us in whatever method you like and will assume you



are a member whenever you can join us. To facilitate your decision, we've picked our books for the next reading season. As leader, I researched book club reading lists and compiled twenty-five titles from which the group chose the ten listed below:

- ⇒ September 2018 **THE CHERRY COLA BOOK CLUB** by Ashton Lee. (We start our year as a book club with a book about a book club.)
- ⇒ October 2018 **HIDDEN FIGURES** by Marget Lee Shetterly. (We read at least one nonfiction, this one about pioneering NASA mathematicians.)
- ⇒ November 2018 **ISCARIOT** by Tosca Lee. (Always we do at least one religious or inspirational title, this one a look at Judas' story from his viewpoint.)
- ⇒ December 2018 THE DEAL OF A LIFETIME by Fredrik Backman. (Our Christmas selection this year is a short novella, which makes time for a short holiday discussion and a bonafide Christmas party!)
- ⇒ January 2019 **BRITT-MARIE WAS HERE** by Fredrik Backman (Yes, Backman is back). One of our fiction selections, this involves a woman who takes over a failing recreation center and its youth soccer team — sure to be a fun read because of Backman.)
- ⇒ February 2019 **MURDER ON THE ORIENT EXPRESS** by Agatha Christie. (We always choose a literary classic, and after two years ago we promised to actually make ourselves read the choice, no matter how difficult but this one will present no obstacles.)
- ⇒ March 2019 UNDERGROUND GIRLS OF KABUL by Jenny Nordberg. (Another nonfiction choice about young girls in Kabul who masquerade as boys in order to have safer, less restrictive lives.)
- ⇒ April 2019 THE PRODIGAL by Brennan Manning and Greg Garrett. (A second inspirational book that is a modern application of the Prodigal Son story dealing with a mega church pastor who slips from grace and has some work to do toward redemption.)
- ⇒ May 2019 LILAC GIRLS by Martha Hall Kelley. (This fiction piece involves three woman during and near the end of WWII and how their stories intertwine — a thought provoking and somewhat uncomfortable read but worth the time )
- ⇒ June 2019 THE GREAT ALONE by Kristin Hannah. (Kristin Hannah always writes a very readable book, this one about a POW who tries to repair his family and himself by isolating them in the solitude of frontier Alaska. We'll read it to see if his plan works, counting the book inspirational if it does.).

#### **FINANCIAL NEWS**

#### Treasurer's Report as of April 30, 2018

**Operating Income and Expenses** are within the Annual Budget for Income and Expenses through April. Contributions met expectations. The year-to-date total income of \$255,496 included the transfer of \$26,250 of Prepaid Pledges received in December. Income for April was \$64,145 which was \$6,454 above the budgeted amount for April. Expenses were \$48,554 for April and year-to-date expenses totaled \$199,581 which was \$29,195 below the budgeted amount.

**Building Fund** The Building Fund Balance is \$211,583 and Construction Loan funds were used to pay construction and interest costs monthly. During the month Forward in Faith donations totaled \$30,469 and year-to-date donations totaled \$162,131. Building Fund construction and interest expenses related to the new building were \$361,446 for the month.

**Fixed Assets** As construction progresses on the new building there is a significant increase in the value of the Fixed Asset for Building and Grounds which is now at \$6,494,251. The increase is \$3,432,354 higher than last year.
