A Note From Pastor Mark

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Pastor, s Corner One of the great confessions of God's presence with humanity is the story of Abraham and Sarah (Genesis 17:1-7). In spite of great difficulty and big change, our ancestors Abraham and Sarah travel down a path of faith, showing a desire to live with an attitude of gratitude toward God. They trust God to guide them, and to make good God's promises. When God gives them a directive, they obey. When they are challenged, they look for God's wisdom. When God gives them a promise, they look forward to its completion.

In the meantime, they do not stop using their minds, trying to figure out how they can partner with God.

Sometimes they get it wrong, but they always believe God will show up. And God does show up.

Notice what Abraham does when God tells him that he and Sarah will have many descendants, including kings, and a land to possess (Genesis 17:6, 8, 16). Abraham bows clear to the ground, face down, in respect and humility. And what does God ask of Abraham and Sarah (Genesis 17: 1)?

He asks them to walk with him, in his ways, to be without blame (Psalms 22:24ff).

He asks them to know that he listens to cries for help, and that he cares about suffering, and that he alone has dominion over all the earth.

A descendant of theirs, King David, reminds the people to praise God, to honor and revere him, to seek and fear him, to turn and bow down before him, to kneel and worship him, and to remember what God has done (Psalm 22:23ff).

We, as Abraham's descendants, are to follow in our forefather's ways of obedience (Romans 4).

This does not mean only following the Law, for it is impossible as humans to be perfect. It means to have hope in God, in whom all things are possible.

It means to lay aside our ego and pride, and allow God to enter into our thoughts and actions.

- Have you made a gratitude list?
- Have you seen ways that you can trust God?
- What challenges do you bring to God in prayer?
- Look for opportunities during this Lenten season leading us to the cross and Resurrection Sunday to praise and honor God? When was the last time you bowed down in praise of our righteous God? To trust God, we must come to know him.

What points you to God? Make prayer, worship and reading the Bible a priority in your life. Bless you in your journey and walk with Christ.

Ministry Musings

In Luke 6:27-38 Jesus gives what the church calls "The Sermon on the Plain". In this teaching, Jesus talks about blessings and woes as he does in Matthew. But he takes it one step further as he calls his listeners to love their enemies, to bless



and give even to those who curse and take. That's not easy! Our world professes the principle of giving to those who can appreciate the gift and reciprocate. But Jesus challenges us to a higher standard; to give to those who most likely won't respond appropriately.

In this passage, Jesus is speaking not to the world in general, but to his followers, those who like us, the kingdom of God already belongs. They (and we) can expect to be treated unjustly by the world, yet they (and we) are to respond as those who are already shaped by our new identity as the children of God.

But how do they (and we) do that? How do we live differently from the world regarding our enemies?

Jesus give his listeners (and us) new lenses through which to view the situation. From Jesus' point of view, we are the ones who are blessed because of our share in the kingdom, even though we may be hated and insulted. Our generosity is modeled after the mercy of God and comes out of that same abundance. We are to give, not from the position of one oppressed, but of one who already shares in God's riches. By giving without expectation of repayment, we who are Jesus' disciples can help to break the expected cycle of retribution.

As a child I was often told to live by the "golden rule"; do unto others as you would have them do unto you. That is a great was to love others and to treat people kindly. But Jesus radically challenges us to go one step further. We are to love our enemies and that is a very difficult task indeed. Our response is not to be based on their behavior. According to Jesus, enemies are not only to be forgiven, but like friends, are to be loved, blessed and prayed for. Enemies are on equal footing with friends. Turn your cheek, give your coat, hand over your shirt, to anyone...everyone, for all are equal, enemies and friends. Jesus' call is to do good to those who do bad to us.

The dilemma...how do we move away form our natural instinct to match ugly word for ugly word, hurt for hurt, to make sure others know how bad they have been to us? How do we live our lives with grace and kindness instead of harboring hurts and anger or reacting with words or actions that seek to answer hurt with more hurt?

The invitation of Jesus is to live in a way contrary to our human nature, a way that is only possible as we live out of a new power, born from above. Faith in Christ is more than agreeing with doctrines, it's a way of life that is different to our own inclinations.

Jesus revealed that the nature of God is to be merciful. The next time

we want to react, we need to both remember God's great mercy and then call on his power to live as a people to whom God has shown mercy.
