A Note From Pastor Mark

Pastor's
Corner

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Have you ever participated in a small group and felt like you didn't belong? Maybe your interests or personalities were different, and no matter how hard you tried, or how much you wanted to belong, it just wasn't a good fit.

Have you ever felt that way visiting a church?

On the other hand, imagine you joined a group of some sort and, to your delight, the others made you feel very welcome, and you began to grow and contribute.

That is always the hoped for response from people who experience what God is up to at Shepherd of the Prairie.

In Romans 5:11-22, the writer Paul, talks about grafting into Christ – accepting Christ and taking on the role of a Christian. Paul says “we put off the world's ways and follow the teachings of Christ.

We are adopted, or grafted, into the world of believers. Your fellow believers come from every race and tribe in the world, yet all belong to the same root that strengthens and guides them.

God warns us, though. Should we fail to render kindness, we will eventually be cut off. (It sounds harsh, but that's what the text says!) Our actions will show whether we belong to God or not.

When we plant a garden or a tree, we expect something to grow. It's the same thing when we're grafted into the fellowship of Christ. Faith without works is empty, just like a barren garden or a dying tree offers only what might have been. God grafted the wild branches (Gentiles) into the established roots (Jews) in order to replace the original branches that became unfruitful.

What does it take to be fruitful? We can serve others. We can smile, we can greet people as they enter church, we can give of our time and money, and we can pray for those in need.

We can be Christ's hands and feet at work in the world. We can draw strength and life from the true root in Jesus Christ.


Adult Education

Three things are happening soon, and if Jesus doesn't return in the next few weeks, you need to put these on your calendar--immediately!



First, on **Sunday, August 18**, Dr. Martin Marty, renowned theologian, writer and Lutheran pastor, will be here at SOTP, **2 pm**, to talk about the church today and our future tomorrow. Dr. Marty has been interviewed numerous times on NPR because his insights into the challenges of the church-in-the-world are incredibly perceptive. You won't want to miss this, the first in our series of inviting the broader community into our midst beyond Sunday worship.

Second, beginning on **Sunday, September 8 and Wednesday September 11**, we'll inaugurate a **new year of Bible study**, starting with the books collectively called "Wisdom Literature": several of the psalms, Proverbs, Job, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Songs. These insightful books draw on the wisdom of God as well as the wisdom of the world as they help us to navigate through the ups and downs of daily life. They also lay the foundation for our study later in the fall of the Gospel of Matthew, the main gospel for this next year.



Third, once again we're offering **Bible 101!** This time we'll meet on **Saturday, September 28, 10-2**. So far almost 200 people have joined us for this adventure into the basics of the Bible: where it

comes from, why we have it, the different types of literature that the authors used, what the Bible does and doesn't do. A sign-up sheet will soon be available on the bulletin board across from the office suite. Watch for it!

Remember these dates--and come join us!

Ministry Musings

I recently read a blog about how judgmentalism can hurt a church and it gave me pause and got me thinking.

As I often do, I looked up the meaning of "to judge" in the dictionary. To judge means:

- To pass sentence upon
- To form an estimate or evaluation
- To hold an opinion by comparing
- To form a bad opinion of someone's behavior, often because you think you are better than them
- To officially decide who will be the winner of a competition

Then I went back and reread the blog with those definitions in mind. Doing so reminded me of all the judgements I make upon a daily basis. "Why can't he get here on time." "She should keep a better eye on her kids at the pool." "She should think before she speaks." "He should be kinder to people." "Why can't he get his work done on time?" "Come on, get moving! The speed limit is 55 here!" "Get off your phone!!!" And many others. Thinking it over, I couldn't believe how many judgments I make about people in a single day!

The blog mentioned how judging others is the basis for racism, sexism, and almost every other 'ism' you can imagine and how it is absolutely incompatible with the faithful walk Jesus calls us to. Jesus said in John 13 that the world will know that we are his disciples by our love. In many circles, Christians are better known by their judgements than by their love.

This blog mentions four things with which being judgmental is incompatible. The first area is LOVE. The presence of judgement almost always guarantees that love will be absent. Again, in John 13, Jesus gave his disciple (us, me) a new command, to love one another as he loved us. He didn't say judge one another, or fix one another, or decide that I am better than one another. He said love one another. Before I approach another, I need to deal with my own issues and encounter a loving God who forgives and restores me. Then, after having been loved so completely by God, I can love others. And to remember, that if I am judging you I'm not loving you. I can't love and judge at the same time.

The second area that judgment affects is HELP. As a rule of thumb, those who judge don't help, those who help don't judge. Judgment upon another creates a line; a line that means "better than", "smarter than", "more righteous than" you. Sure, sometimes my 'one another' makes mistakes, and if I am called by the Spirit to do so, I can bring that to their attention lovingly. But I can't forget to do

what Jesus said in Luke 6 about looking first for that plank in my own eye before I try to tell my 'one another' about their speck. The purpose of removing someone else's speck is to help them, not to make them worthy. The reason God calls me to step into another person's shoes is not to judge them, but to help them. If my motive isn't to help them, then I shouldn't bother; I'll probably only make it worse. And if I am truly working to help them I won't carry a sense of judgement.

The third area that judging others affects is HUMILITY. Judging often brings out those ideas mentioned in the definition noted earlier. Judging is never grounded in humility, it is most always grounded in arrogance. When I judge others, I tend to carry with myself a sense of condescension (I'm would never allow that to happen to me or it must be their fault) or pity (oh, poor, stupid you). Judgement always says I'm better, smarter, more righteous than you and of course I'm superior to you. When I judge, I always make myself out to be the winner of the "competition".

The last area is PRAYER. Judging someone and praying for them are pretty much mutually exclusive. I may judge you and pray about you, asking God to change you or your mind so that you come into line with my much better way of seeing things. But I can never truly pray for one that I judge. On the other hand, if I want to stop judging you, I need to pray for you. To pray that God blesses your socks off; that he gives you all you need; that he gives you more than he gives me; that he surrounds you with his presence, grace and mercy. It's pretty much impossible to judge someone and truly pray for them at the same time.

God never asked me to judge the world; he asked me to love it. The same is true for his people. He never asks me to judge his people; he commands me to love them as I love myself. To serve my neighbor as Jesus did; to wash feet, to carry my cross, to lay down my life (and my judgements). WOW!



Here is the scoop:

Once people have signed up, all names are split into groups of 6 to 8 people with a designated start up person. We encourage everyone to participate, singles and couples, in order to get to know the folks you see at service!

Each small group then decides for themselves when and how they want to meet. Typically, each month there is a host couple who provides the entree, and the remaining participants fill in with appetizer, salad, and dessert. Then the next month there is a different host couple and those taking care of the appetizer, salad, and dessert rotate as well. In that way each month one couple or person is responsible for a different course of the meal. Each group meets 3-4 times for the current session depending on the number of couples or singles in the group.

Other groups have decided to order in Chinese or pizza, or go out for the evening to change things up a bit. It is entirely up to the group how they would like to handle the details.






PLANT WATERING HELP NEEDED
