As we start off the Advent Season, I always try to think of new ways we can celebrate this season with our families and what important things we should remember during this time. Of course, we can think of the typical Christmas celebrations that go on and all the fun traditions we carry on, but what about the celebration of what is to come? What is the month of December leading us up to and how can we teach our kids what Advent is really about?

This is a season of waiting and anticipation, but what, or who, are we waiting for? It surely can't just be Santa and all the presents he brings for Children... It has to be something bigger than that, and it came in the form of a baby thousands of years ago. This season is a time of joyful anticipation for the birth of our Savior, Jesus. It is a time for us to be reminded of the greatest gift the world could



have ever received and that was God's one and only son. What a gift indeed! For the four weeks of Advent, translated to "coming" or "coming toward" in Latin, we are celebrating each milestone that leads us towards Christ's arrival. The Savior that God promised, and was prophesized in the Old Testament, has finally come and made his appearance. This was a tremendous event that changed the course of all human history. A fulfilled promise in the form of a baby that would become the focal point of God's big narrative for all people and the world.

During this season, colors play an important role, and they are usually displayed in the candles that are lit each Sunday Service near the altar. They are a symbolism of the milestones we take as we wait for the arrival. Sometimes there are three blue candles and one pink, or there could be three purple candles and one pink. Whether blue candles or purple candles are used, they both signify royalty that Christ brings in his birth. He is the King of the world, and these colors best represent that. The pink candle signifies the joy that comes with Christ's arrival and the joy we have as we wait for this promised gift. For the first two Sundays, the blue/purple candles are lit. The pink candle is lit on the third Sunday and the final blue/purple candle is lit at the final service which is usually Christmas Eve. This is all a part of the big anticipated celebration, and it is a good way to remind our children, and ourselves, of what is to come!

This is a season of excitement, love, anticipation, and celebration. All things, as people, we know well. Our children understand the meaning of anticipation as they wait 25 days for Santa to come and to open presents, but reminding them of the greatest gift that we wait for is the real focus of this wonderful season. Not to say all the other traditions are not fun, but being able to teach our children about the greatest gift we could ever receive is a gift in itself. Let us remind them what the candles we light mean, why we sing wonderful Christmas hymns such as "The First Noel" and "Joy to the World", and why the birth of a baby thousands of years ago changed the course of history forever!

BARNABAS CAREGIVING

The Barnabas Ministry began in February 2017. Since then, two workshops have guided a group of people to encourage and care for God's people through listening. The Ministry is named after St. Barnabas, the Apostle first mentioned in the book of Acts (4:36-37).



Our primary caregiving is visiting shut-ins living at home or in assisted living facilities, the hospitalized, or those with chronic health problems and those experiencing acute or chronic grieving.

Last month's October visitors made 24 recorded visits. This was in addition to visits made by Pastor Mark, Donna Kelly.

Currently there are 21 active Barnabas Ministers . During visits we engage in conversation, laughter, memorable experiences, sing, administer communion, share news of the church, or brighten a day. Four "Card Ladies" send monthly greetings to shut-ins, another reminder of God's Love from Shepherd of the Prairie.

During the winter months we will meet on the second Tuesday at 10 am. Pastor Mark or Donna Kelly assist in facilitating the meeting. Members lead in devotions and discussion using "Christian Caregiving" handbook.

Our church is blessed and is a blessing to so many through Barnabas Caregiving Ministry.

SMALL GROUPS

SOTP is working on something new and exciting; a Small Groups Ministry!

As SOTP grows in numbers and ministry, we need to find ways to enable all of our members to connect with each other in



enjoyable and meaningful ways. A great way to do that is through small groups. A small group is a gathering of 8 to 12 people who meet on a regular basis for fun, fellowship, and support. A group consist of people with like interests (young families, retired people, enjoy the same hobbies), or it can be a group of people who just like to be together, or even a group of people looking to get to know each other. Small groups can be fellowship groups, service groups, or Bible Study groups.

But, small groups have a few things in common: they pray at the beginning and end, pray for each other between get-togethers, care for each other regularly and when particular needs come up, and they usually include some type of service project together on a somewhat regular basis (help out at P.A.D.S., Northern IL Food Bank, Feed My Starving Children or Green Trees, etc.).

We already have some groups here at SOTP who fit this description, but we would like to offer more ways to connect. So, we are going to offer a congregation-wide opportunity for participation in some new Small Groups. We will be kicking off this program the first week in February, with an 8-week commitment that will take us through Lent.

We are looking for people to serve as leaders or hosts for the groups as well as people to participate. We will provide training for leaders as well as materials and help along the way. More information will be coming so watch for it.

Meet, Greet and Eat!

Sign up at or on the sign-up sheet in front of the office. The **deadline for** sign-up is December 28, 2019.



Here is the scoop:

Once people have signed up, all names are split into groups of 6 to 8 people with a designated start up person. We encourage everyone to participate, singles and couples, in order to get to know the folks you see at service!

Each small group then decides for themselves when and how they want to meet. Typically, each month there is a host couple who provides the entree, and the remaining participants fill in with appetizer, salad, and dessert. Then the next month there is a different host couple and those taking care of the appetizer, salad, and dessert rotate as well.

In that way each month one couple or person is responsible for a different course of the meal. Each group meets 3-4 times for the current session depending on the number of couples or singles in the group. Once the winter session is complete, if you choose to sign up again, then the co-chairs form different groups from the sign-ups.

If you choose not to cook, you may decide to order in Chinese or pizza, or go out for the evening. It is entirely up to the group how they would like to handle the logistics so the designated lead in the initial phone call will discuss with the rest of the group, how everyone wishes to proceed; host, order in or go out to dinner.
