A Note From Pastor Mark

Pastor's
Corner

Where does your food come from? In our urbanized society it's common for someone to answer, "from the grocery store." Of course, we know that's not the source; it's only a convenience.

Our food grows from the earth.

We live in a society of plenty. And we know that our "plenty" requires laborers and farmers for growing and harvesting. These things don't just happen. Yet no matter how much we labor, the earth must have good soil, and the weather conditions must be favorable, and the seed must be good, in order to reap the harvest. A host of natural disasters such as drought, storms, flooding and soil erosion can dash our hopes and change everything. The future is never certain.

In Matthew 6, Jesus teaches his disciples what we call "The Lord's Prayer" in connection with his teaching to "go into your room and pray." Prayer is not about showing off, but about our personal relationship with God, praying for God's Kingdom to come, and praying for our daily bread. Isn't that interesting?

Food and salvation go hand in hand.

In Isaiah 25 we see this connection between food and salvation. On the mountain of the Lord, "the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples of rich food filled with marrow, of well-matured wines strained clear" (verse 6). Isaiah proclaims in this vision of salvation that all tears will be wiped away, and death will be no more.

Daily bread, feasting, is the sustenance of life. It is the center of salvation. In the church, we remember Jesus, in the last supper, giving bread and wine, his body and blood, for our salvation. This act is central to Christian life and faith. Food is involved. It is the sustenance of life, and here it is experienced in community.

Jesus taught us to pray, "give us this day our daily bread." It is for all of us together, in communion, gathered together, eating together. Salvation is meant to be experienced in community. That's why families (should) eat together, and why we encourage our church family to join us on Wednesday night for dinner in "fellowship halls"

It's about fostering belonging and community.

Even as many of us have plenty, many in the world, and some in our own communities, are left jobless and hungry. As we pray, "give us this day our daily bread," are we including everyone? Right now, more than 1 billion of the 6.8 billion people on earth are undernourished. Millions of these die each year from lack food. Shepherd of the Prairie faithfully support World Hunger Appeal of the ELCA.

As we begin this New Year, please know how thankful I am for the many

Wisconsin and spent a weekend together just enjoying each other's company. When my husband Russ died, the flowers I received from the "Green Lake Gang", meant more to me than I could ever say. The support this group gave me when my mother died was overwhelming and we all worked together to support another family when both parents became very ill at the same time.

Russ and I also were part of a Marriage Encounter leadership small group. As we worked together to plan and lead Marriage Encounter weekends, the closeness we shared was the nearest thing to heaven I can imagine.

These small groups had a few things in common that made them so special and satisfying. First of all, they each had Christ at the center. Together we worshipped and praised him. Second, they all shared in Bible study and prayer as we looked for God's leading. Third, we cared for one another; when one needed help, we were all there to do and give what we could. Not that there were never any disagreements, but with Christ as our center and others as our focus, we were able to strive to love each other unconditionally. Fourth, we prayed; for each other and for our ministry daily. Then, we played together. We had fun! Whether it was going bowling, a summer picnic, Christmas caroling, weekend outings, family game nights, or just being together telling stupid jokes, we enjoyed each other's company. Lastly, we served together. Some of the groups were formed to serve, some just found ways to care for others and the world around us.

These small groups made lasting connections and a huge difference in my life. I truly believe my life would have been very different had I not been part of these small groups. I hope you have had small group experiences in your life as well. And now you have the opportunity to be part of one again, or for the first time. My prayer for you in the new year is that you will become a member of a small group here at SOTP and take the time to work with the other members to make your group one that prays, studies, worships, plays, cares, and serves together; that you will create a lasting connection that will make a difference in your life.




GIVING TREE

FINANCIAL NEWS

Treasurer's Report as of November 30, 2019

General Fund Report The General Fund Balance is \$180,291. Income for the month was \$62,635 and Expenses for the month were \$62,610. At this point in the year our Income is 4% greater than last year and \$66,000 less than projected in the Budget. Expenses were \$56,880 less than projected in the Budget.

Mortgage Service Fund Report The Mortgage Service Fund Balance is \$76,954. Income for month was \$18,439. The required monthly mortgage payment is \$19,536. At this point in the year the Mortgage Fund Balance is equal to just under four (4) months payment.
