In Remembrance of Me

As We Gather

Welcome to the longest service of the church year. In the earliest tradition of the church, the three services included in the packet are one. Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday flow from one gathering to the other as we walk alongside Jesus these three days. Tonight, we are participants in the two great commandments given by our Lord, "love one another" and "do this in remembrance of me." We hear Peter not wishing his feet to be washed and Jesus' response, "unless I wash you, you have no place in my kingdom." When we receive Jesus' body and blood, we remember and proclaim Jesus' death. As the writer of Hebrews explains, now there is no longer a need for further sacrifice. God remembers God's steadfast love and, for Jesus' sake, forgets our sins. We are, therefore, able to come into God's presence and also move one another to love and good works.

They are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith.



"The Living Last Supper"

(As we participate in worship tonight, we remember the night Jesus was betrayed. The washing of feet as a symbol of loving service, the meal instituted by Jesus as nourishment for the journey of faith, and the betrayal are all part of this night. Listen to the disciples' message as they share a brief reflection upon their life, in relationship to Christ. Each reflection is a response to Jesus telling the disciples that one of them will betray him.)

Stripping of the Altar

The meaning of this moment is manifold. 1. The altar represents Christ's body in two ways. It is symbolic of the humiliation of Jesus at the hands of the soldiers. Also, it is symbolic of the care that was given to his body after his death, Upon the death of any Jewish person, the body is reverently stripped of all clothing and other items. 2. It represents the abandonment of Jesus by his disciples. 3. The stripped altar represents the barrenness of the cross and helps us reflect on the emptiness of the world without Christ. 4. It is symbolic of the Israelites having to leave quickly to follow Moses out of bondage. God is telling us to pack everything. We leave this space a somber people, weighed down by sin, but we return a brand new community of believers on Easter morning.

Siblings in Christ, on this most holy night when our Savior Jesus Christ passed from death to life, we gather with the church throughout the world in vigil and prayer.
