#### Reading

Reader: The Reading today is from Ephesians 4:1-6

## Psalm

Reader: The Psalm today is from Psalm 78

Yet he commanded the skies above, and opened the doors of heaven; **he rained down on them manna to eat, and gave them the grain of heaven.** Mortals ate of the bread of angels; he sent them food in abundance. **He caused the east wind to blow in the heavens, and by his power he led out the south wind;** he rained flesh upon them like dust, winged birds like the sand of the seas; he let them fall within their camp, all around their dwellings. And they ate and were well filled, for he gave them what they craved.

## Gospel: Mark 6:45-52

*Preacher:* The Gospel according to Mark the 6th chapter. *Congregation:* **Glory to you, O Lord**.

Immediately he made his disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, to Bethsaida, while he dismissed the crowd. After saying farewell to them, he went up on the mountain to pray.

When evening came, the boat was out on the sea, and he was alone on the land. When he saw that they were straining at the oars against an adverse wind, he came towards them early in the morning, walking on the sea. He intended to pass them by. But when they saw him walking on the sea, they thought it was a ghost and cried out; for they all saw him and were terrified. But immediately he spoke to them and said, "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid." Then he got into the boat with them and the wind ceased. And they were utterly astounded, 52for they did not understand about the loaves, but their hearts were hardened.
